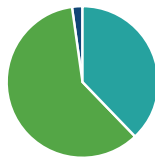


## AT A GLANCE: Kaiser Permanente's Participation in Medallion Medicaid

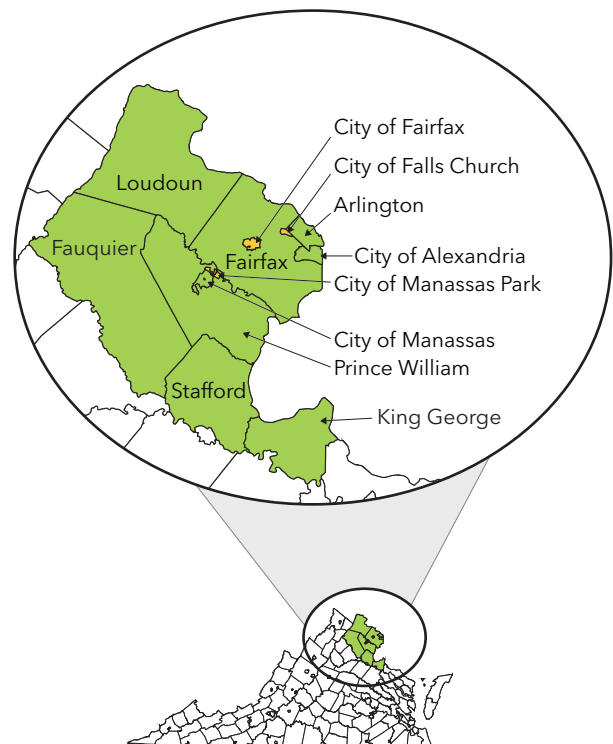

### Participation

Kaiser Permanente currently participates as a Medallion Medicaid provider in 7 counties and in the 5 cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Manassas, and Manassas Park.



Kaiser Permanente contracts with Virginia Premier health plan to provide care on a capitated basis (meaning a fixed payment per member, per month).

## Quality ★★★★★

In 2018, the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA®) awarded Kaiser Permanente's Medallion Medicaid plan 5 out of 5 stars for our performance on measures related to consumer satisfaction, prevention, and treatment. This is the highest rating of any plan in the state.

Kaiser Permanente performs in the NCQA® 90th percentile or above\* for the following measures:

- Breast Cancer Screening
- Cervical Cancer Screening
- Diabetes: Screen for A1C Control
- Diabetes: A1C Control
- Diabetes: Eye Exam
- Diabetes: Kidney Monitoring
- Diabetes: BP Control
- BP Control
- CAD: Beta Blocker Use
- Timely Postnatal Visits

These metrics are based on NCQA's Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS), a tool used by more than 90% of America's health plans to measure performance on important dimensions of care and service.

## Telehealth

Due to COVID-19 and the need to limit transmission of the virus, the usage of telehealth services has increased. Within the Virginia Medicaid population, the combined usage of scheduled telephone visits and video visits has increased over four-fold. In May 2020, Medicaid members in Virginia had approximately 7,000 virtual visits compared to approximately 1,700 virtual visits in January 2020, prior to COVID-19.
